

#### Dear all,

At the conclusion of this year, Mrs Cato will be retiring after an amazing 37 years of service, the vast majority of which has been at our school. Throughout her brilliant career Mrs Cato has enriched the lives of all her students, passionately engaged children in sport and has relieved as principal on a number of occasions. It goes without saying that she will be dearly missed here at Terara but we have some comfort in knowing she will often be popping in! I've been advised from staffing that Mrs Julia Buckingham has been appointed to fill Suzanne's position on a full time permanent basis. Mrs Buckingham lives in the Shoalhaven and currently teaches at Gwynneville Public School near Wollongong. During a brief telephone conversation last week Mrs Buckingham told me how delighted she is to begin her association with our fantastic school. I know the community will join me in thanking and congratulating Mrs Cato on a stellar career and in welcoming Mrs Buckingham into the Terara School community.

I'm excited to hear that our school has been successful in our request to implement the highly regarded *Reading Recovery* program next year.

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*Reading Recovery* is an intensive literacy program delivered individually to eligible Year 1 students every morning for a semester. There are strict selection procedures in place and up to 4 places available for Year 1 students if they meet the criteria. To make the program viable in a small school setting we are sharing the *Reading Recovery* position with Greenwell Point Public School. Mrs Belinda Walker will be undergoing Intensive *Reading Recovery* training throughout 2011 and delivering the morning sessions both here and at Greenwell Point. For half the year Mrs Walker will be running the program at Terara for 5 mornings per week and the other half of the year she will be doing the same at Greenwell Point. Belinda will also attend training sessions every second Friday.

*Reading Recovery* will be Belinda's sole responsibility throughout 2011 so she will not be on a class as she has been in recent years. While it is unfortunate that she will not be on a full class throughout 2011, I'm very excited about the opportunities having a trained *Reading Recovery* teacher in our school will provide throughout next year and beyond. It's simply too good an offer to refuse!

Belinda and I attended a meeting about the program today. Students are not selected for the program until the beginning of 2011 but if you have any questions please do not hesitate to ask.
