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Dear all.

The Federal Government's controversial My School Website will be updated on December 3rd and while the focus last year was on the unethical comparisons that can be made against schools, this year the attention is sure to shift towards financial data provided on each school.

Having seen a preview of our school's page I can assure you the figures are grossly misrepresented. The DET's overall operating costs are broken down and added to each public school's data, significantly inflating school financial figures. Our school data is not solely for Terara School but includes a percentage of overall DET resources such as the salaries of DET personnel across the state as well as capital programs, utilities and teacher salaries.

I would love to receive the \$908634 the website states we have to run our school but unfortunately this is not the case! While MySchool claims our funding equates to \$10690 per student in reality the general operations figure on our funding entitlement is \$111.36 per student, including \$50 from the Federal Government. Furthermore we received \$1473 from voluntary contributions from parents based on \$38 per student as agreed upon by the P&C. The website's suggestion that we have received \$37311 from parent sources is misleading as it includes all moneys paid by parent including excursions, tuckshop etc.

While many private schools will be revelling in the data showing how much money the public schools are allegedly receiving, we know that in reality the gross inequity in funding between public and private schools continue. The reality is that the 30% of students who attend private schools continue to receive 70% of funding.

NSW Public Schools are used to doing more with less and it is this sort of misinformation that is damaging to public education. Only a true and accurate comparison of individual school (not departmental) data can show the inequity in the funding of our public and private schools.
